



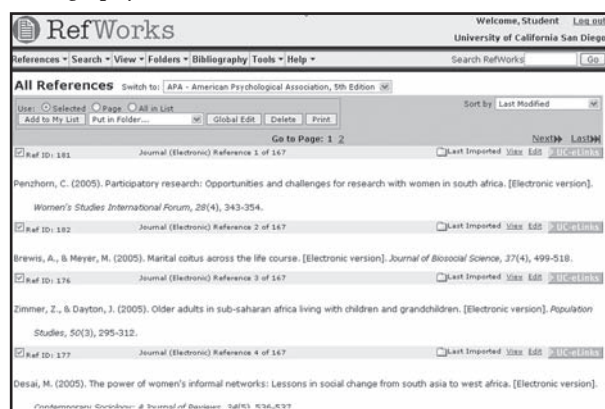

# Dread Writing Bibliographies? Let RefWorks Do it for You!

It's Midnight. You've just started writing your paper and it's due at 9am tomorrow morning. What about your bibliography? Oh yeah. You haven't even started thinking about the bibliography. Don't worry; you've put all your references in RefWorks. Now, press a button and your bibliography is done!



RefWorks is now available to anyone at UCSD. It's similar to creating a "My Favorites" list, but for all of your research references. RefWorks allows you to manage all of your research via the web, instantly generate a bibliography and format your research papers using APA, MLA, and many other citation styles. ### Talk to Us via Instant Messaging

Now, when you have a quick question, you can "instant message" (IM) the UCSD Biomedical Library expert staff for immediate help!

IM is the newest way for you to get help from the Biomedical Library. You can talk to library staff, weekdays from 9:00 am to 5:30 pm, using AOL, Yahoo, GoogleTalk, or MSN services. If you're at any of the Libraries' computers, use Meebo, a free web-based IM service (<http://www.meebo.com>) to instantly connect to the Biomedical Library.

## Happy Birthday, Dr. Seuss

Every year, at Noon on March 2nd, the UCSD Libraries host a birthday party in honor of the late Theodor Seuss Geisel, a.k.a. Dr. Seuss, whom the main library building is named after. This year, Mrs. Geisel, widow of the beloved author, UCSD Chancellor Marye Anne Fox, and University Librarian Brian Schottleander were on hand to greet attendees and help serve some 2,000 pieces of cake to UCSD students and staff.

The birthday event began with our Music Library's Toy Piano Band performing songs from the Cat in the Hat Songbook and then, at noon, playing the traditional Happy Birthday tune as a signal to start serving birthday cake and punch. A new work for the library rooftop carillon was also premiered that afternoon. The piece, Tritone Étude, was composed by undergraduate Raymond Robles, a music composition major enrolled in Thurgood Marshall College.

### Chinese, Japanese, and Korean Script & Library Computers 中日韓

UCSD Libraries' computers, called InfoStations, have recently been configured to display and allow input in Chinese, Japanese, and Korean (CJK) languages. You can now view a variety of websites and research tools in CJK and search for information using these languages. This is the first step taken by the Libraries towards establishing a multilingual interface for all of its InfoStation computers.

If you're using an InfoStations, look in the right hand corner for the gray toolbar that reads "EN" (for English language) and click on that toolbar to change the language mode. It's that simple!

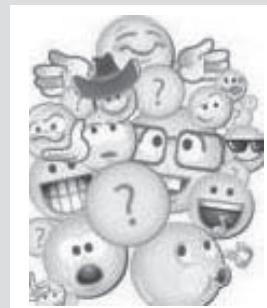
