Professional Development

Program

This year's program "*Tillett's Travels: the Course of a Rewarding Professional Career as a Librarian*" was held on Thursday, June 13 from 10:00 – 11:30 AM in the Seuss Room. Dr. Barbara B. Tillett is the chair of the Joint Steering Committee for Development of RDA and recently retired chief of the Policy and Standards Division of the Library of Congress. She is an internationally known expert on bibliographic and authority standards. She also worked at the UCSD Library, 1973-1994. She was the former head of the Catalog Department (1987-1994) and the former director of the SIO Library Technical Services (1977-1987).

LAUC-SD R&PD invited Barbara to speak us on the topic of the role and impact of professional development activities on the course of her career in librarianship. She talked about her career and her involvement in ALA and IFLA, especially on the development of international cataloging standards, FRBR, IFLA Cataloguing Principles, RDA, etc. When asked how she managed changes, she said that you need to look the good things it will bring and hold on to that.

There were 65 attendees joined the program. The program was well received, with comments noting her positive outlook being particularly pertinent in this time of organizational change. The program was funded by LAUC-SD R&PD funds. To promote the program, Roger also asked the Mentoring Committee Chairs to spread the word to mentees, library school students, etc. about this talk.

Support

As in previous years, the committee decided to supplement individual librarian professional development budgets this year with an additional \$100. All LAUC-SD members were given the option to "opt-in" for the extra funding, and the names of those who opted-in were provided to DBF. Ninety-two percent of librarians requested the supplement (49 out of 53).
