are here at A & P to talk with you because A & P is UNFAIR to Farm Workers by selling ran-Farm Worker Union lettuce and grapes. This practice helps to continue:

CHILD LABOR

Over 800,000 children work full time in the fields. Most of these children will never get to go to school beyond the 8th grade.

PESTICIDES

Hundreds of workers are poisoned each season by the uncontrolled use of dangerous pesticides. Death due to respiratory diseases is 250% higher among farmworkers (compared to national rate). Some experts believe these pesticides are harmful to customers also.

LOW WAGES

Average yearly income of a family working together in the fields is \$2,700, and lettuce workers receive only 1/20 for each head of lettuce they pick.

AFL-CIO, OTHER SUPPORT OF BOYCOTT

The nearly 14 million-member AFL-CIO threw its full weight behind the grape and lettuce boycott by announcing its endorsement of the boycott on April 8. Last November, the National Conference of Catholic Bishops endorsed the demands of the United Farm Workers. The National Council of Churches and Jewish religious leaders have also given support to the United Farm Workers, APL-CIO in their struggle for fair treatment.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- . Don't buy head lettuce and grapes, unless you actually see the Farm Workers Aztec eagle symbol on the packages.
- Ask the manager of this A & P store to discontinue carrying non-Farm Worker lettuce and grapes.

Tell your church, union, women8s club, civic club, and neighbors about the boycott.

Come to a United Farm Workers Rally and Concert on Thursday, August 1, at 8:00 p.m., at Horace Bushnell Congregational Church, corner of Albany and Vine Streets in Hartford. Cesar Chavez, President of the United Farm Workers, will be the main speaker.
