Farm Workers Accepted As Union by A.F.L.-C.I.O.

George Meany announced today that the United Farm
Workers Organizing Committee, headed by Cesar Chavez,
had been accepted into the
American Federation of Labor
and Congress of Industrial Relations as a full-fledged union.

The farm workers, numbering some 30,000 members, have had the status of organizing committee for the last several years since first being formed.

Mr. Meany, the A.F.L.-C.I.O. president, said that the Chavez union would probably be renamed the United Farm Workers National Union.
