

AROUND THE NATION; Chavez Joins Marchers In Boycott of Campbell

Cesar Chavez, the leader of the United Farm Workers, today joined about 100 migrant farm workers who are on the last segment of a month long walk through Ohio and Pennsylvania symbolizing their demands for better pay and working conditions from the Campbell Soup Company.

Mr. Chavez, who joined the marchers in the northwestern Philadelphia suburbs, said he planned to remain with them through Sunday, when they expect to reach the Campbell headquarters in Camden, N.J.

He said the group's small size would not make a difference "because what we're dealing with is a moral question, and you don't need a big crowd to affect people regarding moral issues."
