FACTS ABOUT TEXAS FARM WORKERS (Compiled from material published in the Texas Observer, February 3, 1978)*

INCOME

- -Texas Minimum Wage Act stipulates \$1.40 per hour for farm workers.
- -Annual per-capita income amounts to \$2,919.00.
- -Median family income (family of 6) is \$3,990 per year.
- -78% of farm worker families in Texas have incomes below the federal poverty level.

EMPLOYMENT & THE EMPLOYER

- -There is work in the Rio Crande Valleyonly 5 months each year. (Thousands of Texas farm workers migrate out-of-state in order to make a living.)
- -- Most farm workers must seek work through a labor contractor;
- -The shorthandled hoe, el cortito, is still in widespread use.
- -The Texas Workers Compensation Act still excludes farm workers.
- -60% of Texas citrus is held by absentee landlords.
- -Weslasco, a wholly owned subsidiary of Royal Crown Cola, has amual sales of \$25 million.
- -Griffin & Brand, Inc., dominates the vegetable market, with \$34 million in annual sales. It markets under the G & B and Trophy labels and grows, packs, freezes, ships and markets its fresh and frozen vegetables, G & B has a London sales office and operates in 4 other states plus extensive holdings in Mexico.

EDUCATION

- -86% of farm worker children do not complete high school.
- -70% of adult farm workers have less than 4 years of school:

HOUSING

- -Most farm workers live in unincorporated rural communities known as colonias, which lack water, sewer and gas lines and paved streets. The control of the contr
- -One-third of the Rio Grande Valley colonias have no water at all; water is hauled in from nearby irrigation canals or golf course sprinklers. There are no public sewer systems; after heavy rains many colonias stand in water for days.

HEALTH

- -TB mortality rates are 250% higher than national average.
- -Strep throat 300% higher than for wealthier Texans.**
- -Hepatitis 110% higher than for wealthier Texans.**
- -Scarlet Fever- 300% " "
