



How to Search PsycINFO

HOW TO SEARCH PsycINFO

The PsycINFO database provides access to international literature in psychology, cognitive science, and related disciplines. Coverage is from 1806-present. Sources include over 1,800 professional journals, chapters, books, reports, theses and dissertations. Many full-text articles are available online. PsycINFO is a department of the American Psychological Association.

From the Social Sciences and Humanities Library webpage (sshl.ucsd.edu) click on Databases A-Z, click on the letter P, and click on PsycINFO.

Advanced Search

- You may search by Keywords, Author, Title, Descriptors, etc. For searches on a topic you may search by Keyword or Descriptor.

Advanced Search by Keywords

- If your Keyword search retrieves a large number of results, look at the Descriptors of the relevant records. Conduct another search using these Descriptors.

Advanced Search by Descriptors

- Descriptor searches are more precise than Keyword searches. To identify Descriptors (subject headings) for your topic, check your terms in the online Thesaurus (link to Thesaurus is located at the bottom of the screen.)

Note: If your topic or terms are not listed as Descriptors, search as Keywords. You can also conduct searches using both Descriptors and Keywords.

- Most books are not yet available online; therefore, click the ROGER Catalog link to find out if the UCSD Libraries owns the book.
- Full-text University of California (UC) dissertations from 1996-present are included in the Dissertations & Theses database.

If the UCSD Libraries does not own the journal article, book, or dissertation:

- Request the item through Interlibrary Loan.
