To My Hannah Bond Widow & William Bond yearnan both of Waterlann in the County and Province aforefaid, Greeting.

WHEREAS Jonas Bond late of Watertown

deceased, having while he lived, and at the Time of hy Decease, Goods, Chattels, Rights or Credits in the County aforesaid, lately died Intestate, whereby the Power of committing Administration, and full Disposition of all and singular the Goods, Chattels, Rights and Credits of the said Deceased; and also the hearing, examining, and allowing the Accompt of such Administration doth appertain unto Me:

TRUSTING therefore in your Care and Fidelity, I do by these Presents, commit unto you full Power to administer all and singular the Goods, Chattels, Rights and Credits of the said Deceased: and well and saithfully to dispose of the same according to Law; and also to ask, gather, sevy, recover and receive all and whatsoever Credits of the said Deceased, which to him while lived, and at the Time of his Death, did appertain, and to pay all Debts, in which the said Deceased stood bound, so far as and Goods, Chattels, Rights and Credits can extend, according to the Value thereof: And to make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels, Rights and Credits; and to exhibit the same into the Registry of the Court of Probate for the County aforesaid, on or before the Joseph Secundor Day of September next ensuing: And to render a plain and true Accompt of your said Administration upon Oath, at or before the Joseph Secundor Which will be in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Sinne

AND I do hereby constitute and appoint you Administration of all and singular the Goods, Chattels, Rights and Credits aforesaid.
