I bes yll let my frd know how much I am straitened for
money & how ill I take it of him I have not had relief
from him ever this. I think he might have sent something
but it bin ever so little, if he could not have sent good
or money, he might have got one a Letter of Credit from
some of his friends & sent one, w^t would have bin of service
to Clarendon here, tell^r his f^r character at my coming here
of being a vast rich man / how it came to sperme I know not,
not by from my self I am assured onfor I never so much as
contributed to it by so much as consenting to it, but on the
contrary endeavoured to prevent it spreading any further
& only same could have had on Credit I would but fear shall
lose f^r Character If he don't concert himself upon to my
advantage in remitting me Effects as desired, I desire him
to let me know by whom he intends to shipps, f^r know
secure, & not lose my Assurance money again as paid
by Capt. Smith by whom I received 200 £ ov^r was spent
off to me. tell him I am obliged daily to relieve my poor
relations, who as they are already with him are very poor
tell him they have ^{had} $\frac{1}{4}$ of f^r money I brought with me
already, w^t he knows was not a great deal, tell him if
possible & if send him f^r scovanty he write for Dr. Capt.
f^r next year at prothles if I can get money to fit them
out ov^r I find to be as scarce here as in Jamaica. I could
do a great deal more, but f^r having bin an eye witness
to my condition can say more verbailey than is convenient
to write f^r in so doing yll too over engage me

as my own
