Oh My Dr what I dreaded came to my ears yesterday  
of yr being Dangerously ill I want say more than that  
my prayers My good God has heard & restored you to yr  
better health than do my Dr, yr part & be carefull of  
it & try to get well that you may return again to me  
longing arms & but just now yr Distracted Mollie

I have sent toverhill, Mama & Papa insist on yr  
keeping him, as he may be off service to you, he  
being a handy fellow & willing. As soon as you are able  
let me hear from you & do take such methods for  
yr return as may not endanger yr health.

Papa Mama & family here whose love & affection I  
find is much stronger the two former especially  
desires to join in prayers & best wishes to you & the  
babes are well & I am brave & conclude w<sup>th</sup> all that's
