Dear Thom

Having this opportunity by absence of Mr Harding
(and not omit writing to you; tho so late by Mr Huslock;

a Committee of the assembly had yesterday a conference with a Committee
of the Council. who have resolved it necessary to continue the
present assembly for six weeks and then to stand dissolved which
will I believe be unanimously agreed to. This I believe will keep
us here a week or two longer tho I determine not to exceed that
and in the mean time should be very glad to hear from you

Capt Aldin from Bristol who loads at Blaquiere is arrived & I expect
will go down in about a fortnight by whom I expect we shall have
our passage; I hear there is four or five ships came in yesterday
but cant learn who they are

I pray you will give all dispatch possible to Richards & Gardner
I know that I may have no complaints; I should be very glad to know
from you how Mr Allen behaves at Swin; Mr Elephant gives
him away bad Character. but whether from prejudice or what I cannot
tell. He charges him with not being honest. I pray you will
direct Mr Bryan to get the mill in order; and have the guttering
all ready paid to put up; and the coffee finished when you have
briefs I have ordered some from Savannah; and some of the
first opportunity can be had from Kingston.

If they have planted all the old land in Canes that was stuck up
I think it advisable to let the new land Mr Bernard sell, alone till
the crop of plant with Tops; and go to clearing up the land above
the Hill Canes over the river sojourn on the old negro ground to
have it ready to plant with the tops of those plant Canes when
cut; but in that or what else you shall judge best to direct
him refer entirely to you; I am with best wishes
