recover'd of the Measles and shall goe down stairs tomorrow but  
my Cough is a little troublesome. my Brothers and Sisters are  
all Brave, my Mama would have wrote but is <sup>not</sup> very well.  
she has been Complaining ever since Friday last my Mama  
desires me to tell you that my Uncle Dunn's are coming on  
to her every Day and wishes that you would speak to him  
I am glad to hear Miss Lewis is so well, all their. Join with  
my in Duty to your self & Love to Miss Lewis.

Dick Godolphin came here.  
I found me so ill he had me putt into most Dutfull Daughter  
bed where I am confin'd with a violent vomiting & purging w<sup>ch</sup> is rather  
fouier with the pangs of Colic lowe & rackes

of a plawter laid all over me & have hardy  
strength to write but am desirous of telling you  
for Mollys Letter I bid you forrest w<sup>ch</sup> I think  
a modell pretty letter & better sense than I thought her  
capable of. Adieu my dear once more Adieu God bless you forever
