Dear Son

27 August Monday fore
noon

Your Father was taken with the Gout last
Tuesday evⁿ. has bin very sever and fear it will
Continue so far some time He was not able to De-
termine any thing about the Burnes in Town
till this Day, and as it is impossible Ole can
go to Town him self, has got Mr Bowes
to go with instructions about the affair
and Ole sets out this afternoon

If you could spare time to come over here, I
would be very glad to see you, as well as your
Father, my Neighbors at Stones Cove are
going to survey their Land there, and as I
apprehend I have a good Deal of said place
Land within my Bounds, fear if I have
not a person of some Judgement to advise me
mine Shall cost a great part of it

Your desire me to tell Ole can think of nothing,
Ole is in such pain, and desires you order every
thing at Stone as you think proper, I fear this
fit of the Gout is owing to the bad situation of
His affairs which makes me very uneasy —
but as I hope to see you soon Shall say no
more about it, my kind love and blessing
hend you & yours, your Father desires this

I am Dear Tom — Your most affectionate Mother

I understand you are to receive Money
some money for Mr Pelin pray put him in mind
to send Mr Hungerford money, over as Ole has askt
me to get it for him, & Ole credit Mr. Pelin on my account
