

of this artist who is acquainted with your full confidence  
properly so I paid for your account the  
£ 13 pounds due to the painter Scogog leaving  
besides unclaimed Mr. Gabrielli of which he had  
paid for making of the case packing latter  
expenses I have added to your own the freight to  
Leghorn postage & commission included as per  
Note on the other side amounting together to  
£ 2 12 0 - Stars which according to your wishes  
I have caused to be drawn by my house of  
Tolomei &c on a Dr. N. L. G. Miller  
in London on your account & I beg you will cause  
it to be honored upon presentation.

Robert W. Balli is satisfied  
with his plausibl<sup>e</sup> horses & that he will be content

to leave again his extensive farms for a second visit  
to the Continent & this place particularly as he  
has promised a Fathday but your return can remove  
the great trouble of living Rome so suddenly as you  
did at the approach of our grand signal &  
greatest. We may say we are pretty gay this  
year too without Emperors, though we have every  
good English Society who are fond of gallies parties.  
Halls, banquets succeed very rapidly one to another  
Prince Leopold of Saxe Coburg is here since to  
soothing the English complexion of his living very  
retired at an unfortunate season receiving no  
company nor giving any dinner.

my or my house's services if they could be any  
way useful to you. I beg you will forgive my  
bad compliment to Mr. Hall
