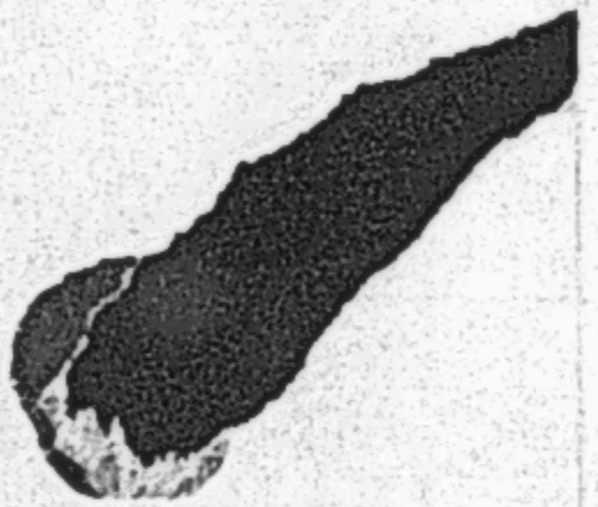

I avail myself with great
pleasure of the opportunity which is offered to
me to remind me to your memory & that of Mr. Hall
by the shipment of an other of your pictures
commissioned to Mr. Gabrielli by you. By direction
of this Artist who is executed with your full confidence
I have paid for your picture the
St. Louis & to the painter Strozzi & having
been reimbursed Mr. Gabrielli of what he had
paid for making of the case, packing & other
expenses I have added to our own the freight to
Lisbon, postage & commission included in the
Note on the other side amounting together to
£ 25..5..0. Stamps which according to your wishes
I have caused to be drawn by my house of
Tortomas & on Messrs. M. & S. Miller
in London on your account & I beg you will cause
it to be honored in presentation
I hope Mr. Hall is satisfied
with his pleasurable harvest & that he will be content



to leave again his extensive farms for a second visit
 to the Continent to this place particularly as he
 has promised a Ketting but your return can repair
 the great fault of leaving Rome so suddenly and you
 did at the approach of our grand signal &
 gayeties. We may say we are pretty gay this
 year too without Emperors things We have a very
 good English Society who are fond of gayeties parties
 Balls, Concerts succeed very rapidly one to another
 Prince Leopold of Saxe Cobourg is here since a
 fortnight the English complaint of his being very
 retired at an unparliamentable town receiving no
 company nor giving any dinners

I hope you will not spare
 my or my house's services if they could be any
 way useful to you. I beg you will present my
 best compliments to Mr Hall
