U.S. Steamer Douisiana, New Berne, April 13 962 Sunday, A. M. Dear Box. Milliam :-We have just arrived her after a two day's cruige up the Pambico and Pungo sivere. We went at the Pambico to finish our work of destroying the batteries on the banks of that river, and blew whe the magazines &C. They were very formiduble works, and the rebels might have given us warm work had they remained to dispate aar possission. They had built many fin house for barracks, sapinor in every realist, to than af our troats, and then they had left standing. From Pungo view we brought three sefuger fam dies, mun women and children. Me took this on board last evening; and as we had no slupping accomodations for them, they were alliged to sit whim the engine room. Me brought all their household function away with as, ad of the formition decomption.
