DESCRIPTION: This accession includes index cards noting underwater observations collected for a Kelp Bed Fish Food Study from 1958-1959, skin diving and fishing observations when Quast was an ichthyology student at UCLA, and 35mm slides of Richard Rosenblatt, Jay Quast, Jean (Mrs. Pat) Kauanui [an SIO Institute of Marine Resources technician], Elbert Ahlstrom, and Scripps work including fishing. The field notes were taken on the Southern California coast and the west coast of Baja California. Includes Kelp Program memoir.

- 2 Carl Hubbs deep-sea fishing for rockfishes off the Channel Islands using electric reels and stainless steel wire lines. On Scripps T-boat, 5 January 1956
- 3 Wall-net divers off Punta Banda, Baja California (Papalote Bay) for the Scripps Kelp Program. Personnel aboard the boat: Conrad Limbaugh (nearly bald head and facing camera behind scuba tanks), Jay Quast (facing camera and seated at boat console), and Pat Cunnison, the Program's photographic technician (seated to right of Quast). 10 August 1959
- 4 Setting wall-net off Punta Banda, Baja California (Papalote Bay) for the Scripps Kelp Program. James Stewart is at the helm of the boat. 10 August 1959
- 5 Jean Kauanui at Gaviota, diving technician for the Scripps Kelp Program, who assisted Quast in making surveys of kelp-bed fishes there. 15 July 1960
- 6 Jay Quast in skiff at Pilot Rock, Guadalupe Island, Mexico, where he estimated fish populations by making counts along line transects. January 1960
- 7 Jean Kauanui, diving technician for the Scripps Kelp Program. Photo taken on Scripps Buoy Boat off Coronado Islands trip, 1 February 1961
- 8 Dr. Elbert "Ahlie" Ahlstrom, Director of the US Bureau of Fisheries, National Marine Fisheries Service Laboratory at Scripps. He is presenting data on the hake fishery off California, probably at the US Commerce Department's Montlake Laboratory at Seattle at a conference in 1972.
