He said the company workers would have four choices in the election: UFW; the Agrupacion Independiente de Trabajodores de Royal Packing which has been formed by former Teamsters Union organizers, and "no union." Co., which is what Chavez calls a company union; the Independent Union of Agricultural Workers,

Delizonna conceded the so-called company union is, in effect, a vote for "no union," but said it still has the right to be on the ballot. He said even a
