Call from Wendy Batson, La Paz, Friday, Sept, 26, 1975

1. The church groups are holding press conferences today in San Francisco and Los Angeles - we hope for good coverage - another religious group is planned for October 5, 6, and 7 - ask our supporters and get names to the office

2. The Executive Board wants to get 100,000 letters to Gov. Brown:

Our main problems stem from the growers who are pressuring workers to vote for No Union and if we have support, for Teamsters. We can't stop them directly - only the Board can - but the Board won't act - today a UPI report quoted Walter Kintz (General Counsel of the Board) as saying that the Board can not take action against local law enforcement agencies (who are the tools of the growers). Board won't act without Governor - so we'll pressure the Governor. The Gov has been wanting good press - lots of elections, held quickly

So the letters...

Cesar is going to California towns to generate publicity - discussing the Unfair Labor Practices of growers, etc. Religious groups are doing same as impartial observers.

Walter Kintz's staff is accepting the growers' words as to # of workers - there is not any checking even if there seems to be 500 workers missing....

For letters - stress politicians and labor folk to get them out. can use form letters for bulk - write up a few different and get them signed.

Include something like

- a. the new law is being jeopardized in terms of effectiveness cause of Unfair labor practices
- b. call for replacement of General Counsel to the ALRB - want someone who will investigate all the ulp's and bring fair elections.
- c. Brown made a campaign promise to protect the farm workers' rights and he is failing miserably.
