Kennedy joined the Mrs. workers in a parking lot across the street from the Monterey County Jail, then went inside to visit Mr. Chavez, the organizer of a nationwide boycott against nonunion lettuce.

She was greeted by boos, curses and shouts of "Ethel go home" as she walked past the antiworker pickets, who identified themselves as members of the Citizens Committee for

Agriculture.

Mrs. Kennedy talked with Mr. Chavez through a glass partition in the visitors' room for 15 minutes, then left the jail through a rear exit after sheriff's deputies urged her not to risk provoking an incident with the counterdemonstrators.

A local newspaper reporter said some of the counterdemonstrators were connected with produce growers in the Salinas

Valley.

The anti-Chavez demonstrators carried placards reading "Chavez Flaunts the Law" and "Reds Lettuce Alone." They interrupted the mass several times by shouting, "Reds go home!"

Witnesses said Mrs. Kennedy appeared apprehensive when she and her bodyguard, Rafer Johnson, the former Olympic decathlon champion, passed in front of the anti-Chavez demonstrators before entering the jail.
