Butz and Reagan Discount Efforts of Chavez's Union

MIAMI BEACH, Aug. 23 (AP) — Earl L. Butz, Secretary of Agriculture, and Gov. Ronald Reagan of California spoke out today against the boycott-lettuce campaign of Cesar Chavez, the worker organizer.

Dr. Butz said at a news conference that Mr. Chavez was wrong when he gave the impression that only his United Farmworkers Union produced

union lettuce.

He said that the International Brotherhood of Teamsters picked and packed the bulk of the lettuce in California and, furthermore, that this union had started putting it in red, white and blue boxes stamped with a "Re-elect the President" symbol.

Governor Reagan said that Mr. Chavez's union was merely in a jurisdictional dispute

with the teamsters.
