

FARM UNION ADMITS IT HECKLED CAVETT

Dick Cavett told his audience Thursday night that the interruption of his program by hecklers Wednesday night had been caused by representatives of the United Farm Workers of California, the migrant workers union headed by Cesar Chavez.

Mr. Cavett explained over his American Broadcasting Company late-night show that he had been in touch with representatives of the union for several weeks over his and A.B.C.'s responsibility in carrying ads for wines produced by companies being boycotted by the union. He said that, despite the interruptions, he planned to give the issue serious study before commenting and described the labor differences as "very complicated."

The union's responsibility for the interruptions was confirmed Thursday by Marshall Ganz, who is heading the boycott of nine Napa Valley vineyards, from the union's La Paz headquarters in Keene, Calif.

Mr. Ganz said two of the companies being boycotted, Korbel and Beringer Brothers, advertised on the Cavett show.

"We feel that Mr. Cavett and A.B.C., in denying that they have any responsibility in this area, are simply dodging the issue," Mr. Ganz declared. "Sure they have a responsibility."
