

Farm Workers Accepted As Union by A.F.L.-C.I.O.

MIAMI BEACH, Fla., Feb. 21
George Meany announced today that the United Farm Workers Organizing Committee, headed by Cesar Chavez, had been accepted into the American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Relations as a full-fledged union.

The farm workers, numbering some 30,000 members, have had the status of organizing committee for the last several years since first being formed.

Mr. Meany, the A.F.L.-C.I.O. president, said that the Chavez union would probably be re-named the United Farm Workers National Union.
