

359 U.F.W. PICKETERS RELEASED FROM JAIL

FRESNO, Calif., Aug. 14—Dorothy Day, the New York Roman Catholic radical leader, and 358 other supporters and members of the United Farm Workers union were released last night from the Fresno County jail, where they had been held for up to two weeks for violating court orders restricting picketing activities.

The U.F.W. has been mass picketing in violation of court orders at grape ranches where the union has been trying to organize workers.

Their release followed a court ruling last week that allowed most of them to be released on their own recognizance without any limitation on picketing activities.

Miss Day, looking tired but chipper after 11 days in jail, was greeted by Cesar Chavez last night outside the jail where the farm workers and their supporters were reunited with their families.
